

The Meaning of Christmas and Christmas Songs

The meaning of Christmas can vary for different people and cultures, but it's generally celebrated as a Christian holiday that commemorates the birth of Jesus Christ. For Christians, Christmas is a time to reflect on the significance of Jesus' birth, emphasizing themes of love, peace and good will to all.

Beyond its religious roots, Christmas has evolved into a widely celebrated cultural and festive occasion in many parts of the world. It often involves exchanging gifts, spending time with family and friends, decorating homes and trees with festive ornaments, and partaking in special meals and traditions.

Christmas is a time of spiritual reflection on the important foundations of the Christian faith. It's also a celebration. It is when Christians celebrate God's love for the world through the birth of the Christ child: Jesus. The Bible tells of his birth hundreds of years before, fulfilling prophecies.

The precise origin of assigning **December 25** as the birth date of Jesus is unclear. The New Testament provided no clues in this regard. **December 25** was first identified as the date of Jesus' birth by **Sextus Julius Africanus** in **221** and later became the universally accepted date. Christian writers frequently made the connection between the rebirth of the sun and the birth of the Son.

Christmas began to be widely celebrated with a specific liturgy in the 9th century but did not attain the liturgical importance of either <u>Good Friday</u> or <u>Easter</u>. Catholic churches celebrate the first Christmas mass at midnight, and Protestant churches have increasingly held Christmas candlelight services late on the evening of December 24th.

Renaissance humanist <u>Sebastian Brant</u> recorded, in *Das Narrenschiff* (1494 *The Ship of Fools*), the custom of placing branches of fir trees in houses.

The tradition of the Christmas tree was first observed in Strasbourg with fir trees decorated with apples in 1605. The first use of candles on such trees is recorded by a Silesian duchess in 1611. The **Advent wreath** - made with fir branches, with four candles denoting the four Sundays of the Advent season - began in the **19th** century. The **Advent calendar** was created in the **19th century** by a Munich housewife who tired of having to answer endlessly when Christmas would come. The calendar provides **24** openings, one to be opened every day starting **December 1st**. Towards the end of the **18th century**, the practice of giving gifts to family members became well established. The coming of the **Magi** was related to gift giving.

If you live alone or have medical problems and need someone to check on you, take advantage of the Lake County Sheriff's Office's Senior Watch Program.

- When you join, you'll be assigned an identification number. Then, just call the Senior Watch telephone operators each morning and tell them how you feel.
- If the Senior watch operators don't hear from you, they'll call you. If you don't answer the phone, they'll try to contact one of your neighbors or a relative to check on you.

 If they still can't contact you, a deputy will be dispatched to your home.

Turning Pages

I don't identify as a mystery novel reader, but I do enjoy a puzzle or mystery with a focus on character. In a nod to the LST Jesse Stone movie mavens, my most recent read was a Robert B. Parker novel. Parker wrote the first six books in the Sunny Randall series, and after his death in 2010, his estate chose to continue her exploits. The series continued with Blood Feud (2018) and Grudge Match (2020) written by Parker's friend, sports journalist Mike Lupica. The eleventh book in the series, Bad Influence, was written by Alison Gaylin and published in 2023. Sunny's most recent adventure, Buzz Kill, is also written by Gaylin. It's a classic who-done-it in a contemporary setting. Gen Z whiz kid Dylan Welch, with his lifelong best friend and business partner Sky Farley, founds Gonzo Energy Drink, which becomes massively successful. Indulged by his billionaire family, Dylan is lazy, entitled, duplicitous, and immoral. Although his family is encouraged by this apparent newfound focus in his life, given his past escapades, no one is terribly concerned when he disappears until he doesn't reappear. Convinced by his worried mother to find Dylan, Sunny Randall unearths every possible skeleton in Dylan's personal closet and uncovers a deadly conspiracy involving the recipe for Gonzo. Of course, murders ensue, legit clues are dropped, and red herrings appear until Sunny finally puts it all together. Dylan is rescued, and the murderer is identified. This was a fun read, if typical, but I really enjoyed getting to know Sunny Randall, former cop and divorced partner of Mafia made man Richie Burke. Sunny's personal life is woven into the plot as she must decide whether to retire, as her former husband seems to desire, and seeks advice from friends and family, including her dad Phil and former father-in-law Desmond Burke. As she wrestles with her decision, the investigation into Dylan Welch threatens both Sunny and her family.

Another mystery series author whom I enjoy is Louise Penny. Her series of novels concerning the cases of Armand Gamache, detective and eventually commander of the Surete in Quebec, are also quite formulaic. But Penny goes out of her way to explore the Commandant's relationships with a wide range of quirky characters that populate the setting of Three Pines, a small village loosely based on Penny's hometown of Knowlton, Quebec. Sincere emotions and moral crises are stock in trade for Penny as Gamache pursues murderers, corrupt officials, and terrorists. Gamache's family and friends are often put directly at risk, and Gamache himself has endured betrayal, attempted murder, and life-threatening injury. In one story line, Gamache's investigation leads to the imprisonment of a close friend. It is not until several more books in the series that he realizes his mistake. He is a flawed character himself, which allows Penny to philosophize about evil and good and to explore the complexities of power. The 19th book in the Armand Gamache series is The Grey Wolf. In it, Gamache and his trusted lieutenant son-in-law Jean-Guy Beauvoir and Isabelle Lacoste are tasked with preventing a horrific act of eco-terrorism. The investigation of two seemingly unrelated ganglandstyle killings leads the team to the discovery of a plot that could destroy Quebec and threaten the entire world. To save Quebec and their homes in Three Pines, they travel to remote monasteries in Canada and France, to the Vatican, and to Washington, DC on a manhunt for the person who can supply the critical information about the attack. Before the case is closed, everyone is suspect old friends, current bosses, former enemies. A whistle-blower and several cryptic clues in the form of notes secreted in Gamache's belongings finally allow the team to thwart the terrorists' plan as those corrupt officials at the helm are exposed. Part of the appeal of Penny's books is the serene and innocent setting of Three Pines coupled with its population of eccentric artists, storekeepers, restaurateurs, and retired professionals—a poet and a psychologist.

The next meeting of the Better Than Therapy Book Club is on Fri. Dec. 13, in the Clubhouse, at 2:00 PM. We'll be discussing Susan Orlean's nonfiction book "The Library Book." Our club meets on the 2nd Fri. of each month, year round. New members are always welcome! Contact Carol Roberts at 937 - 409 - 2844.




